1. CALL TO ORDER & ROLL CALL

Alan Gordon, Chairperson, called the California Alternative Energy and Advanced Transportation Financing Authority (CAEATFA or the Authority) meeting to order at 10:34 a.m.

3. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

Ms. Carrillo reported that under the Bond Program, the annual audit for fiscal year 2014-15 was completed by Gilbert Associates, Inc., and had no findings. This audit is statutorily required by Senate Bill 99 (2010) which requires the State's conduit issuers and joint power authorities to provide regular financial information. The audit, along with previous audits and financial reports, can be found on CAEATFA's website.

Ms. Carrillo continued by reporting that under the Sales and Use Tax Exclusion (STE) Program, CAEATFA is hosting its first workshop on March 16, 2016 related to incorporating projects eligible under AB 199, with a public comment period ending March 25, 2016. CAEATFA anticipates holding an additional workshop in April and bringing regulations to the Board for consideration in May.

Ms. Carrillo stated that, under legislative updates, AB 2334, introduced on February 18, 2016 and co-authored by Assemblymembers Mullin and Ting, has been referred to the assembly committee on revenue and taxation. The bill would increase the STE cap to \$350 million, include a roll-over provision and clarify that subcontractors may utilize the STE.

Ms. Carrillo continued with personnel updates: Kim Hong has joined the CHEEF team with a background in business and Dallas Aicega has joined the core team, with a Master's in Organizational Communications.

Ms. Carrillo added that under her delegated authority, on February 23, 2016, she executed an interagency agreement with the State Treasurer's Office (STO) for reimbursement of annual building rent, security expenses and other related costs incurred by the STO for CAEATFA during the term July 1, 2015 through June 30, 2016 for \$51,690.

4. BUSINESS ITEMS

A. REQUEST TO APPROVE MEMBERS FOR THE WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP CRITERIA FOR A COMPARATIVE ASSESSMENT OF ENERGY EFFICIENCY FINANCING PROGRAMS IN CALIFORNIA

Ms. Bonnett reported that as part of the 2015-16 Budget Package, the California Legislature tasked CAEATFA with creating a working group of key stakeholders to develop criteria for a comparative assessment of energy efficiency financing programs available in California, including PACE, the CHEEF Pilot Programs, and utility on bill financing. In response to this directive, CAEATFA staff is hosting a series of educational workshops that focus on various comparative criteria and methodologies for evaluating energy efficiency financing programs, culminating with a public meeting of a working group. At this meeting, the working group will lead the discussion on a proposal of potential comparative

criteria that will be drafted based on the discussions and comments from the previous workshops. CAEATFA will publish a summary of the issues discussed and the recommendations made by the working group.

CAEATFA staff reached out to stakeholders and developed a list of 41 potential working group members, which includes representatives from several key stakeholder groups. Staff recommends approval of a resolution appointing the proposed list of stakeholders as members of the working group.

Mr. Jerue moved for approval and there was a second by Ms. Ortega.

Mr. Gordon stated there was a motion and a second and asked if there were any other questions or comments from the Board or public. There were none and the item was unanimously approved.
