On behalf of the California Debt Advisory Commission (CDAC), I am pleased to present State and Local Tax and Bond Ballot Measures, Summary of General Election Results, for the statewide election held on November 6, 1990. This is the fourth report prepared by the Commission on the outcome of bond and tax measures submitted to voters at statewide elections.

In addition to tables which summarize the various bond and tax measures which were on the ballot throughout California, this report also provides a brief narrative on some of the emerging trends taking place with regard to bond and tax issues. Most notable among these trends in the November 1990 election was the defeat of 12 of the 14 state general obligation bond measures on the ballot. In fact, most of the defeated state bond measures fell well short of the majority vote required for passage.

The rejection of these bond measures by the voters raises serious concern about the current system for placing such measures on the ballot. That's why I will continue to advocate the creation of a Bond Efficiency Commission which would advise the Governor and the Legislature on the volume and content of bond proposals to be placed before the electorate. This concept, which would rely heavily on a systematic process for identifying the state's capital outlay needs, is currently embodied in AB 48 by Assemblywoman Delaine Eastin.

At the local level, general obligation bond measures, which require two-thirds voter approval, were victorious in nine jurisdictions and defeated in 21 others. It is interesting to note, however, that of the 21 local bond measures which were defeated, 19 received at least 50 percent of the vote.

#### STATE AND LOCAL TAX AND BOND BALLOT MEASURES

#### Summary of the General Election Results November 6, 1990

#### I. INTRODUCTION

This report contains information about 147 State and local bond and tax measures considered by the voters at the General Election held November 6, 1990 in California. There were 19 State measures and 128 local measures reviewed. Only three State measures passed (16 percent) while 16 failed (84 percent). Local measures fared better, with 51 measures approved and 77 defeated (an approval rate of 40 percent).

This is the California Debt Advisory Commission's fourth report on bond and tax measures. Prior publications reported the results of the 1986 and 1988 November General elections and the 1990 June Primary election.

The information contained in this report on the State of California bond measures was obtained from the *Certified Statement of Vote, November 6, 1990, General Election*, compiled and published by the California Secretary of State. Local agency bond and tax measure information was received from the county clerks' departments in the State's 58 counties. The accuracy and completeness of local election data presented depends wholly on sample ballots and voter results provided by those departments.

State and local ballot measures covered a wide range of issues. Voters were asked to approve major public works projects, environmental and safety issues, and governmental services dealing with drug prevention, child care and public health. There were issues to save environmentally sensitive areas, to build parks, recreation, and library facilities, and to provide library and educational services.

For purposes of this report, the category of parks and recreation facilities encompasses not only local parks and recreational facilities, but also the acquisition and preservation of the redwood forests and establishment of a major league ball park. Life support issues include fire prevention and protection, as well as police, emergency medical, and ambulance services. Education issues include K-12 schools, higher education facilities, and educational services.

#### II. SUMMARY OF STATE AND LOCAL MEASURES BY PURPOSE

The measures analyzed in this election fall into five general categories: capital improvements and public works, education, general government and life support, hospitals, housing, and drug programs and prevention. Over 40 percent of the measures analyzed would have provided for some type of capital improvement or public works project. This is in contrast to the 1988 General Election, when over 50 percent of the measures were for general government and life support issues, but only 33 percent for capital improvements and public works projects.

#### A. Capital Improvements and Public Works

This category included 64 measures to provide for capital improvements and public works. Of these measures, there were eight State proposals and 56 local measures. The proposed measures covered parks, recreation, and sports facilities; water, wastewater, and flood control projects; transportation facilities; earthquake repair and recovery; public buildings; prisons and jails; lighting and landscaping; and power generation and transmission.

The preservation of ancient forests and redwoods and reforestation measures provided an environmental focus to the statewide election. While three State environmental measures failed, local measures dealing with environmental issues fared much better. Pacific Grove and Laguna Beach passed measures to acquire a butterfly habitat and open space in Laguna Canyon, respectively. Parks, recreation, and open space issues also were approved by voters in Novato, Cupertino, Oakland, the Sonoma County Open Space Authority, and the Greater Hayfork Valley Park and Recreation District. An advisory vote to acquire coastal dunes in Monterey was also approved.

The only State measure concerning water (Proposition 148) was defeated, but three local water supply measures were approved. Votes on public transportation measures were about even, with five passing and four failing. Los Angeles, Orange, and San Joaquin counties approved sales tax measures for transportation while Marin, Sonoma, Tulare and Ventura counties defeated them. In addition, Placer and San Luis Obispo counties approved measures which would allow gas tax revenues collected in those counties to be used for local transit planning and construction.

Of seven prison or jail measures on the ballot, only the City and County of San Francisco approved their jail issue. The Rockridge Community Facilities District in Alameda County received the lone approval for library construction. Three other public building measures were defeated.

Voters in Santa Cruz County, still cognizant of damage inflicted by the Loma Prieta carthquake of 1989, passed a sales tax measure which will be shared with the cities in the county to support earthquake-related improvements. The tax-sharing agreement was ratified by voters in the cities of Santa Cruz, Scotts Valley, Watsonville, and Capitola.

#### B. Education

There were 23 education measures in the November election. Of that total, nine passed (39 percent) and 14 failed (61 percent). With the exception of one State issue for higher education facility bonds, all of the education proposals were for K-12 school facilities or services. Of the two State education measures, the K-12 school facilities bond proposal passed, while the bond measure for higher education facilities failed.

#### C. General Government/Life Support

Voters defeated nearly two-thirds of the measures designed to provide funds for general governmental purposes and life support services (15 passed, 27 failed). There were 22 general government issues, with only six of those passing. Of 20 life support measures presented, 9 passed and 11 failed.

#### D. Hospitals

All three measures on the ballot to fund hospitals in Northern Inyo County, Tehachapi Valley, and Lassen Community Hospital Districts were defeated. It is interesting to note that while voters in Lassen County overwhelmingly endorsed a measure to form a hospital district, they just as overwhelmingly defeated the measure to finance the district.

#### E. Housing

Two State and three local housing measures appeared on the ballot. The voters approved the State veterans' housing bonds (no veterans' housing measure has ever been defeated), but defeated the State multipurpose bond issue to provide for the homeless, low-income, and first-time home buyers. Imperial County's approval to build a shelter for dependent children was the only one of three local housing measures approved in this election.

#### F. Drug Programs/Prevention

There were five issues dealing with drug prevention programs. All five were defeated.

#### III. BONDS

#### A. State General Obligation Bond Measures

State voters reversed an historical trend in this election by defeating all but two of the 14 general obligation bond measures on the ballot. In fact, in the prior five statewide elections (November General Elections in 1986 and 1988 and June Primary Elections in 1986, 1988, and 1990), voters had defeated just one statewide bond measure out of 30 proposed.

Whether it was the length of the ballot, confusing policy issues, bewildering ballot arguments, or concern over the amount of state debt, voters were reluctant to authorize the majority of state general obligation bonds proposed in this election. While voters did approve \$800 million in general obligation bonds for K-12 school facilities (Proposition 146) and \$400 million for veterans' housing bonds (Proposition 142), they defeated \$4.4 billion in general obligation debt proposed for prison, higher education facilities, and parks, among others.

In fact, only four of the 12 defeated state bond measures even came close to the 50 percent needed for passage. Among those measures which were narrowly defeated was the \$450 million Higher Education Facilities bond measure (Proposition 143) which received 49 percent approval; the \$742 million Forest Acquisition and Timber Harvesting (Proposition 130) and the \$30 million Child Care Facilities (Proposition 151) both which obtained a 48 percent approval rating; and the \$437 million Parks, Recreation and Wildlife Enhancement (Proposition 145) which was supported by 47 percent of the voters. Approval for the remaining measures ranged from 26 to 45 percent.

Statewide ballot propositions may be placed on the ballot by a vote of the State Legislature or through a public initiative process. In this election, there were 10 legislatively-approved bond measures and four initiative proposals. None of the initiative bond measures passed.

State general obligation bond results are listed in Table A-1.

#### **B.** Local General Obligation Bond Measures

Local agency general obligation bonds are secured by a pledge of the full faith and credit and the taxing power of the agency. They are primarily payable from *ad valorem* property taxes and are approved by a two-thirds vote of the electorate. The California Constitution contains several provisions governing the issuance of local general obligation bonds. Article XIIIA (Proposition 13 passed in June 1978) provided that the maximum amount any *ad valorem* tax on real property not exceed one percent of the value of the property. This impaired the ability of local governments to present general obligation measures to the voters that would top the ad valorem ceiling.

Article XIIIA Section 1(b) of the State Constitution (Proposition 46), enacted by the voters in June 1986, eased this restriction by authorizing local agencies, upon a two-thirds vote of the electorate, to levy an extraordinary property tax rate to fund the acquisition

or improvement of public facilities. As a result, there were 17 local general obligation bond measures on the ballot in the 1986 General Election, and 30 measures in the General Election in both 1988 and 1990.

Of the 30 local general obligation bond measures presented to the voters in this election, nine passed and 21 were rejected. The voters authorized a total \$195 million in general obligation bonds and defeated \$1.6 billion.

As noted previously, the two-thirds voter approval required of these bond measures greatly impaired the success of the proposals. Of the measures which passed, the local general obligation bond approval rate ranged from 66.8 percent for a \$60 million recreation, parks, and open space proposal in Oakland, to 81.9 percent approval for a \$2 million water supply and storage project for Sweetwater Springs Water District. Of the 21 general obligation bond measures that failed, 19 received over 50 percent approval from the voters.

The largest proposed general obligation bond measure was an \$817 million issue in Los Angeles County to provide for a variety of local parks, recreation, and open space projects, as well as to provide services to the elderly and to fund programs to prevent gang-related problems. The measure received 57 percent of the vote, falling well short of the two-thirds vote required for passage.

The smallest issue authorized, \$1.23 million to acquire a butterfly habitat in Pacific Grove, received 69 percent of the vote. The largest general obligation bond issue approved was a \$75 million bond for K-12 school facilities in the Santa Monica-Malibu Unified School District.

There were 12 local general obligation bond measures for education on the ballot, with three passing and nine failing. Three of the nine parks, recreation, and open space proposals also passed. A dependent care facility in Imperial County was approved, but two housing issues in Alameda County and Walnut Creek were defeated. Voters also approved one jail measure in San Francisco and defeated one jail measure in Rialto.

Local general obligation bond results are contained in Table A-2.

#### IV. TAX MEASURES

Voters statewide faced decisions on both special and general tax measures. Under the State Constitution, the State and local governments must meet certain vote requirements in order to enact new or higher taxes. Under current law, if the revenue from a tax is earmarked for specific purposes, it is defined as a *special* tax. Conversely, a tax that raises money for general governmental purposes is defined as a *general* tax.

#### A. State Tax Measures

State law requires a simple majority vote for both general and special tax measures placed before the voters.

Four ballot measures proposed statewide tax increases, with two of these (Propositions 132 and 134) constituting special tax measures. Proposition 132, the Marine Resources initiative, passed. The initiative establishes a zone tax and permit fees and a marine protection zone, prohibits the use of gill or trammel nets in that zone, and provides one-time compensation for lost income to commercial fishermen resulting from these restrictions. Proposition 134, an alcohol surtax of five cents per drink, failed. It would have funded life support and drug prevention programs.

Another alcohol-related proposition, Proposition 126, was also defeated. It was a general tax that would have increased excise taxes on alcoholic beverages and provided monies for the State's general fund.

The lone statewide sales tax measure, Proposition 133, which would have increased the sales tax for four years by one half cent to fund a drug enforcement program, failed by a considerable margin, 32 percent to 68 percent.

Proposition 136, a State ballot proposition to further regulate vote requirements specified for State and local general and special tax measures was also proposed. The measure was defeated 47.9 percent to 52.1 percent.

The State tax measures are listed in Table A-3.

#### B. Local Tax Measures

Voters in local elections decided the fate of both general and special taxes. As stated previously, if the revenue from a tax is for specific purposes, it is defined as a *special* tax. Conversely, a tax that raises money for general governmental purposes is defined as a *general* tax. The following, excerpted from the *November California Ballot Pamphlet* prepared by the Legislative Analyst, is a discussion of both types of taxes. This summary utilizes these definitions to categorize the local tax measures.

The vote requirement for a local tax increase varies depending on whether it is a general tax or special tax. New or higher special taxes must be approved by at least two-thirds of the voters. As regards most general taxes, Proposition 62, a statutory measure enacted at the November 1986 election, requires that such tax proposals be approved by (1) two-thirds of the local agency's government body and (2) a majority of the voters.

The requirements of Proposition 62 have been found not to apply, however, to charter cities, which may enact a general tax with a majority vote of the city council.

#### 1. Use/Transaction (Sales) Tax Measures

Local agencies proposed 13 sales tax measures to fund (1) transportation programs, (2) earthquake repair projects, (3) jails, (4) a park and recreation district, and (5) general government activities. Five of these measures were approved and the remaining eight failed.

Local sales tax measures require a simple majority vote if the taxes are intended to support the general purposes of an agency established for a specific purpose, such as a transportation authority, or if the taxes are for general government services in a county with a population of less than 350,000. In either case, counties are restricted to increasing their local sales tax rate to a total of seven percent.

Three of seven local sales tax measures to fund transportation projects were approved. Los Angeles, Orange, and San Joaquin counties successfully authorized one half of one percent sales tax increases for transportation, while four other counties defeated similar measures.

A sales tax measure to provide funds for earthquake repair and to authorize the issuance of up to \$33.5 million in certificates of participation was approved in Santa Cruz County. Cities within that county also approved contracts to share these funds as they become available. The final sales tax measure approved was for one quarter of one percent to fund the Sonoma County Open Space Authority, the creation of which was also approved in this election.

Sales tax proposals that failed included two measures to fund jails (one each in Los Angeles and San Benito counties), and one measure to fund an anti-crime authority in Lassen County.

As previously indicated, California statute gives counties under 350,000 population the opportunity to propose a sales tax rate of up to one-half percent to provide revenue for general governmental services. Voters in Del Norte County, the only agency to propose this tax in this election, defeated this measure. Inyo County is the only county to have ever passed this particular tax.

Local use/transaction tax measures are contained in Table A-4.

#### 2. Special Tax Measures

As discussed previously, most special taxes require two-thirds voter approval. Special taxes are designed specifically to provide a service or improvement to benefit a specific parcel, unit or area of land.

There were 41 special tax measures reviewed in this election, of which 13 passed and 28 failed. Measures receiving approval included a library for residents in the Rockridge Community Facilities District in Alameda County, library services for the North County Library area of Santa Clara County, a water project in Muir Beach Community Services District, an advisory vote on acquisition of open space in the Monterey Peninsula Regional Park District, and nine life support issues.

#### a. Mello-Roos Community Facilities Districts

Included in the discussion of special tax measures are votes for Mello-Roos Community Facility District tax and bond authorizations. Of the five community facilities district measures on the ballot in this election, only one measure passed (Rockridge Community Facilities District in Alameda County discussed previously), and the other four failed. The defeated measures included a drainage project for \$5.9 million in San Bernardino County; two school measures (Yuba City Unified School District for \$61.6 million and Oakdale Union Elementary School District for \$9.8 million); and a special tax for life support services in Moorpark.

Local special tax measure results are contained in Table A-5.

#### 3. General Tax Measures

General tax measures require a simple majority vote for passage and are primarily for general government or district purposes. As discussed previously, Proposition 62, passed in 1986, requires ratification by voters of general tax measures.

There were 26 general tax measures reported, of which 10 passed and 16 failed. The majority of the measures were for general governmental purposes. There were also four measures targeted at parks, recreation, and open space projects; one advisory vote on lighting and landscaping; and a measure to provide power generation and transmission services to Post Mountain Public Utility District in Trinity County.

The scorecard for the general taxes was as follows:

In reviewing the votes, we find that the only utility users tax to pass was in Cupertino, where funds were earmarked to acquire the Blackberry Farm open space. Santa Clara County and Mountain View voters defeated a utility tax measures to fund the acquisition of a baseball stadium. Finally, utility tax measures for general government were defeated in Redlands and Scotts Valley.

Voters in Novato approved a measure to affirm an excise tax, allowing acquisition of Brookside Meadow open space; and the Greater Hayfork Valley Park and Recreation District approved a parcel tax to provide recreation and sports facilities. Local general tax measure results are contained in Table A-6.

#### 4. Other Tax Measures

This category contains measures that reaffirmed existing taxes, approved contracts for shared sales tax revenues, or directed agencies to alter debt issuance procedures. Of the 18 local measures surveyed, 14 measures passed and 4 measures failed.

Of those measures which passed, five school districts in San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara counties approved the extension of existing taxes for educational services; two counties approved the application of their gas tax revenues for public transit programs in the counties; and voters the Los Carneros Water District in Napa County authorized a contract with the State Department of Water Resources. An advisory vote by the City of Santa Clara approved a measure to allow participation in a joint powers authority to fund a baseball stadium. In a related vote, citizens of San Jose defeated their measure to participate in the same joint powers authority.

Local voters rejected measures which would have allowed less stringent debt financing methods in the cities of Anaheim, La Palma, and San Francisco. El Dorado County voters echoed that mood with the approval of a restrictive debt issuance measure which would require a majority vote for each lease or bond deal issued by a joint powers authority in the county.

Other local tax measures results are contained in Table A-7. The other State tax measure is listed in Table A-3.
