Estimated Public Benefits Qualified Residential Rental Project Pool February 15, 2006 Allocation

State and local governmental agencies and joint powers authorities can issue tax-exempt housing revenue bonds. These bonds assist developers of multifamily rental housing units to acquire land and construct new units or purchase and rehabilitate existing units. The tax-exempt bonds are used to fund a loan with a below market interest rate. The low interest rate loan is used by the Project Sponsor to develop the project. Project Sponsors produce market rate and affordable rental housing for low and very low-income households by reducing rental rates to these individuals and families.

The California Debt Limit Allocation Committee is responsible for administering California's annual taxexempt private activity bond program, known as "the annual State ceiling". For calendar year 2006, California's State ceiling is \$2.890 billion. Each year the Committee divides the annual State ceiling among several bond programs, known as "Program Pools", including the Qualified Residential Rental Project Pool (Rental Project Pool). For calendar year 2006, the Committee reserved approximately \$1.635 or 56.6% of the State ceiling for the Rental Project Pool. The \$1.635 billion of bond authority will be allocated throughout the calendar year to three sub-pools i.e., <u>General Pool</u> (consists of projects having 50.1% or more of its total units designated as Restricted Rental Units); <u>Mixed Income Pool</u> (consists of projects having 50% or fewer of its total units designated as Restricted Rental Units); and the <u>Rural</u> <u>Project Pool</u> (consists of projects located in a rural area as defined by California Health and Safety Code Section 50199.21 and not including Mixed Income projects).

The Committee awarded a total of \$4,780,000 of the 2006 State Ceiling and authorized the use of an additional \$3,220,000 in available 2005 carryforward allocation, for a total allocation of \$8 million on February 15, 2006 for multifamily rental housing. The \$8 million allocated on February 15, 2006 will fund 2 multifamily rental housing projects.

The allocations awarded on February 15, 2006 will finance 80 total units, of which 100% will be Restricted Rental Units. Restricted Rental Units are units within a Project that are restricted to households earning 60% or less of the Applicable Median Family Income. Of the 80 Restricted Rental Units, 16 units will be restricted to very low income households with incomes at or below 50% of the area median income and 64 units will be restricted to low income households with incomes between 51% and 60% of the area median income. Of the total 80 units to be financed with the allocation, all will be new construction units and 56 will be large family (3-4 bedroom) units.
