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CALIFORNIA HEALTH FACILITIES FINANCING AUTHORITY ("CHFFA") HELP II LOAN PROGRAM

OVERVIEW

The HELP II Loan Program ("the Program") became operational in 1995, having superseded the HELP Program that began in 1988. The Program is designed to help small and rural health facilities obtain financing for capital needs through low cost loans.

Low interest loans are available for the purchase, construction/renovation of real property; purchase of equipment and furnishing; and refinancing of existing debt to those qualifying as a participating health facility. Other eligibility requirements include, but are not limited to evidence of fiscal soundness, ability to meet terms of the loan, and no more than \$30 million in annual gross revenues (district hospitals are exempt from this requirement).

To summarize the 2015 calendar year:

- 7 loans closed totaling \$3,562,700
- 17 loans paid in full
- 0 loan modifications
- 1 loan remains pending
- 4 loans were approved but did not fund

Loans approved but did not fund, were due to a number of reasons including failure to request funds before resolution expiration date, withdrawn request for funds due to complications of the sale of the real property, the gross revenue pledge requirement, and the prevailing wage requirement.

In addition, at the April 2015 meeting, in an effort to increase loan activity, several changes were presented to the Authority and the following were approved for a two-year period:

- 1. Loan term increase from 15 to 20 years for the financing of real property acquisition, construction or renovation.
- 2. Maximum loan amount increase from \$1,000,000 to \$1,500,000 to allow for the funding of larger projects.
- 3. Interest rate decreased from three percent to two percent for all loans except refinancing. Refinancing loans remain at three percent.

Once the Program changes were approved by the Authority, the first step to determine the marketing strategy was to reach out to its current Borrowers and to solicit input to determine if the Program meets the needs of the healthcare industry. The Program currently has

85 Borrowers with outstanding loans. CHFFA staff developed a questionnaire and contacted these Borrowers to solicit responses to this prescribed set of questions.

Of the 85 Borrowers, 38 provided responses. Generally, the feedback was positive. Some of the specific comments cited the need to increase the maximum loan amount to higher than \$1.5 million, increase the annual gross revenue eligibility to greater than \$30 million, the requirement to pay prevailing wage increased the cost of the project by 20-30%, the application is cumbersome, and the Program needs more exposure and lacked name recognition.

Additional comments, though not specific to the Program, cited issues with increases in the minimum wage, decrease in the number of clients due to the Affordable Care Act, increase in requirements and license fees from the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development ("OSHPD") and slow Medi-Cal reimbursements to health facilities.

Looking ahead, staff will continue to research possible Program changes to better meet the needs of the industry. Proposals being considered for presentation to the Authority in the future include:

- Allow for "interest only payments" for construction loans until construction is completed
- Accept review reports in lieu of audited financial reports when gross revenues are less than \$2 million
- Remove the five percent equity contribution requirement
- Allow short term loans (working capital)
- Raise the gross revenues cap from \$30 million to \$40 million per borrower
- Change the gross revenues cap from \$30 million per organization to \$30 million per facility
- Feasibility of an automated payment system for Borrowers
- Streamline/simplify the loan application

MARKETING

Since the approval of the Program changes, staff has been working on ideas and strategies to market the Program. The goal for 2016 is to increase the number of loans to 10 HELP II loans resulting in a 30% increase compared to 2015 which closed 7 HELP II loans. Staff plans to achieve this goal through outreach, direct mail, and social medial marketing tactics.

As stated, Program Exposure/Name Recognition has been identified as a significant barrier to increasing the numbers of HELP II loans. To this end, efforts have and will continue to be made to increase the exposure of the Program to potential Borrowers.

Efforts thus far have been:

- Identification of state departments and provider associations throughout the state whose memberships include facilities potentially eligible for HELP II loans.
- Meeting with representatives of the Department of Development Services, the Department of Aging, and the California Association of Adult Day Services, a provider association, to provide information about the Program and solicit feedback as to how the Program might fit the needs of their membership/clientele.
- Updated the Program's webpage to reflect the Authority's changes effective April 2015 and revised the Frequently Asked Questions.
- Created a one-page description of the Program highlighting the latest changes and emailed to all those who currently are on the Listserve to receive ongoing information about changes within CHFFA, which includes the HELP II Loan Program.

Moving forward in 2016, additional steps and strategies staff will pursue in the upcoming months include:

- 1. A survey monkey is planned for dissemination to existing Borrowers to better understand the capital needs, and goals to expand or make facility improvements.
- 2. Continue to mail out the Program one-page description to existing and past borrowers, related associations, other state agencies, and stakeholders.
- 3. Develop a PowerPoint presentation on the Program for use at meetings, conferences and informational seminars and to post on the Program's website.
- 4. Utilize OSHPD's facility list to custom sort a target list of small and rural non-profit health facility types to identify potential Borrowers.
- 5. Leverage the mental health grant program and compile a list of mental health non-profit service providers.

- 6. Revise the Program marketing brochure to reflect the recent Program changes made by the Authority.
- 7. Revise the HELP II Loan Application. Revisions may include:
 - Elimination of information that can be obtained from other sources. For example, the request for information on Seismic Upgrades from Acute Care Hospitals was eliminated as OSHPD requires the reporting of this information. If necessary, CHFFA staff can obtain specifics from OSHPD.
 - Ability to complete the Application on-line
 - Remove sections not applicable if purchasing equipment or real property.
- 8. Prepare an article on the Program for an upcoming issue of the Treasurer's Newsletter entitled "Intersections". This newsletter has wide-circulation in California.
- 9. Produce a video featuring a current Borrower on the Treasurer's website. The video would provide information about the Program and feature a HELP II Borrower discussing how the Program enabled the funds needed for upgrades and renovation of the facility.
- 10. Increase Program visibility by attending association conferences. The goal is to attend more conferences than in previous years; a minimum of two conferences per year.
- 11. Partner with California Alternative Energy & Advanced Transportation Financing Authority on energy audits.
- 12. Partner with California Pollution Control Financing Program on its CalCAP program to access potential Borrowers and lending institutions that may refer the Program to potential Borrowers.
- 13. Meetings with other Authorities at the Treasurer's Office, other state departments, counties and provider associations are being scheduled.

Some milestones staff hopes to accomplish on a monthly basis in 2016 are:

- Receive one or more new applications
- Meet with at least one association or other state agencies or other stakeholders
- Send marketing materials to at least 30 potential Borrowers and associations





Types of Facilities Financed




