Review and Analysis of Investment Performance for the ScholarShare Plan for First Quarter 2014

Background

The ScholarShare Investment Board (SIB or Board) and its investment consultant, Pension Consulting Alliance, Inc. (PCA), monitor all portfolios in the ScholarShare College Savings Plan (Plan) in accordance with the ScholarShare Monitoring Procedures and Criteria adopted by the Board.

In this item, SIB will review and discuss PCA's "Investment Performance Status Report" (Exhibit A) for the first quarter of 2014. PCA's report compares each underlying fund allocated to the portfolios used in the Plan, to applicable benchmark criteria and labels the current status of funds as "positive," "acceptable," "caution," or "watch."

For the first quarter of 2014:

- 10 underlying funds were in the "positive" status,
- Eight underlying funds were in the "acceptable" status, and
- No underlying funds were in "caution" status or "watch" status.
- The TIAA-CREF Life Funding Agreements' status as of March 31, 2014 is not yet available at the time of the report publication and will be provided separately at the meeting, if available.

As outlined in its memo (Exhibit B), PCA is not recommending any underlying funds to be placed on "watch" status at this time. TIAA-CREF Tuition Financing, Inc. has also provided an "Investment Performance Report" for the Plan for first quarter 2014 (Exhibit C).

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ECONOMIC OVERVIEW & RISK METRICS HIGHLIGHTS

<u>Economy</u>

- GDP slowed in the first quarter stalling the rally in equity markets
- Inflation remained below the Fed's target of 2% indicating that they will keep interest rates low reducing returns for fixed income assets
- The Fed began reducing their monthly bond purchases which can lead to increased volatility in fixed income investments

Capital Markets

- Global equities were essentially flat for the quarter as global growth concerns weighed on markets
- Domestic equities outperformed international equities as investors focused on a slowdown in emerging markets (notably China)
- Interest rate risk remains high and represents a major headwind for investors going forward
 - ScholarShare is somewhat shielded from this risk due to the funding agreement
- US equity market valuations remain at top decile levels likely portending muted returns going forward
- Non-US equity valuations are below long-term averages indicating potentially better returns than US equities going forward
- Emerging Market equity moved up 3% in March, but remains historically cheap



SECTION 1 ECONOMIC OVERVIEW





During the first quarter of 2014, equity markets managed small gains digesting concerns regarding the Federal Reserve's continued tapering of bond purchases. GDP growth slowed significantly during the quarter (to almost 0%), as intense winter storms on the east coast impacted economic growth. Despite the decrease in growth, the Fed announced a reduction in the degree of monthly bond purchases to \$45 billion at the April 2014 meeting, down from the original \$85 billion monthly level of last year. The Fed backed off the 6.5% unemployment hurdle in regards to continued quantitative easing and indicated it will turn its focus to a range of indicators looking forward. Unemployment remained unchanged at 6.7% in the first quarter. Inflation crept up slightly on a quarter-toquarter basis while remaining under 2.0% for the trailing 12-month period. Returns for developed Non-US equity markets were in-line with US equities during the guarter, experiencing slight gains. Worldwide inflation data continued to be below target, while emerging markets continued to struggle on weaker growth readings. US Bond markets delivered gains in-line with equities during the first quarter, as the Barclays Aggregate Bond Index posted its best quarterly return since the second quarter of 2012.

Economic Growth

- Real GDP increased at an annualized rate of 0.1 percent in the first quarter of 2014 after increasing at an annualized rate of 2.6 in the fourth quarter of 2013.
- A downturn in exports, business investment, and a larger decrease in inventory investment were reflected in the slowdown in real GDP growth during the quarter.

These decreases in growth were partly offset by faster growth in utilities and health care.


Inflation

- The Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased by 1.8 percent in the quarter on an annualized basis, after seasonal adjustment.
- Quarterly percent changes may be adjusted between data publications due to periodic updates in seasonal factors.
- Core CPI-U increased by 1.8 percent for the quarter on an annualized basis.

Over the last 12 months, CPI-U increased 1.5 percent before seasonal adjustment.


Unemployment

- The US economy gained 480,000 jobs in the quarter.
- The official unemployment rate remained unchanged at 6.7% at quarter end.
- The majority of jobs gained occurred in professional and business services, construction, and food services & drinking places.



CPI-U After Seasonal Adjustment





Interest Rates & U.S. Dollar

- U.S. Treasury yields decreased over the quarter.
- The Federal Reserve has maintained the federal funds rate between 0.00% and 0.25% since December 2008.
- The U.S. dollar depreciated against the Yen, Euro and Sterling by (0.2%), (2.0%) and (0.6%), respectively.
- As of quarter end rates remained near low historic levels.


Treasury Yield Curve Changes

- During the trailing 1-year period, bond markets continued to show poor performance as only High Yield produced significantly positive results.






- US equities began the year tentatively but continued to produce strong trailing 1-year results as returns were positive during the quarter.







- US equity markets valuations remain at top decile levels.
- Equity volatility (VIX) is approaching bottom decile levels, perhaps signaling rising complacency.
- Non-US equity valuations are below long-term averages. Emerging Market equity moved up 3% in March, but remains historically cheap.
- Credit spreads continued to tighten, and are at levels last seen in 2007 (risk seeking).
- The slope of the yield curve remains steep, indicating expectations for higher future rates (versus cash rates today).
- Interest rate risk is back in top decile territory. The 10-Year Treasury yield ended March at 2.7%, right where it started the month.
- Inflation metrics point to inflation being low and stable, but commodities showed some strengthening during the month.
- The PCA Market Sentiment Indicator "PMSI" continued to read green.



Risk Overview









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Developed Public Equity Markets








High Yield Corporate Bond Spreads











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
Measures of Inflation Expectations

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METRIC DESCRIPTION, RATIONALE FOR SELECTION AND CALCULATION METHODOLOGY

US Equity Markets:

Metric: P/E ratio = Price / "Normalized" earnings for the S&P 500 Index

To represent the price of US equity markets, we have chosen the S&P 500 index. This index has the longest published history of price, is well known, and also has reliable, long-term, published quarterly earnings. The price=P of the P/E ratio is the current price of the market index (the average daily price of the most recent full month for the S&P 500 index). Equity markets are very volatile. Prices fluctuate significantly during normal times and extremely during periods of market stress or euphoria. Therefore, developing a measure of earnings power (E) which is stable is vitally important, if the measure is to provide insight. While equity prices can and do double, or get cut in half, real earnings power does not change nearly as much. Therefore, we have selected a well known measure of real, stable earnings power developed by Yale Professor Robert Shiller known as the Shiller E-10. The calculation of E-10 is simply the average real annual earnings over the past 10 years. Over 10 years, the earnings shenanigans and boom and bust levels of earnings tend to even out (and often times get restated). Therefore, this earnings statistic gives a reasonably stable, slow-to-change estimate of average real earnings power for Professor Shiller's data and calculation of the E-10 are available on his website at the index. http://www.econ.yale.edu/~shiller/data.htm. We have used his data as the base for our calculations. Details of the theoretical justification behind the measure can be found in his book Irrational Exuberance [Princeton University Press 2000, Broadway Books 2001, 2nd ed., 2005].

Developed Equity Markets Excluding the US:

Metric: P/E ratio = Price / "Normalized" earnings for the MSCI EAFE Index

To represent the price of non-US developed equity markets, we have chosen the MSCI EAFE index. This index has the longest published history of price for non-US developed equities. The price=P of the P/E ratio is the current price of the market index (the average daily price of the most recent full month for the MSCI EAFE index). The price level of this index is available starting in December 1969. Again, for the reasons described above, we elected to use the Shiller E-10 as our measure of earnings (E). Since 12/1972, a monthly price earnings ratio is available from MSCI. Using this quoted ratio, we have backed out the implied trailing-twelve month earnings of the EAFE index for each month from 12/1972 to the present. These annualized earnings are then inflation adjusted using CPI-U to represent real earnings in US dollar terms for each time period. The Shiller E-10 for the EAFE index (10 year average real earnings) is calculated in the same manner as detailed above.

However, we do not believe that the pricing and earnings history of the EAFE markets are long enough to be a reliable representation of pricing history for developed market equities outside of the US. Therefore, in constructing the Long-Term Average Historical P/E for developed ex-US equities for comparison purposes, we have elected to use the US equity market as a developed market proxy, from 1881 to 1982. This lowers the Long-Term Average Historical P/E considerably. We believe this methodology provides a more realistic historical comparison for a market with a relatively short history.





METRIC DESCRIPTION, RATIONALE FOR SELECTION AND CALCULATION METHODOLOGY

Emerging Market Equity Markets:

Metric: Ratio of Emerging Market P/E Ratio to Developed Market P/E Ratio

To represent the Emerging Markets P/E Ratio, we have chosen the MSCI Emerging Market Free Index, which has P/E data back to January 1995 on Bloomberg. To represent the Developed Markets PE Ratio, we have chosen the MSCI World Index, which also has data back to January 1995 on Bloomberg. Although there are issues with published, single time period P/E ratios, in which the denominator effect can cause large movements, we feel that the information contained in such movements will alert investors to market activity that they will want to interpret.

US Private Equity Markets:

Metrics: S&P LCD Average EBITDA Multiples Paid in LBOs and US Quarterly Deal Volume

The Average Purchase Price to EBITDA multiples paid in LBOs is published quarterly by S&P in their LCD study. This is the total price paid (both equity and debt) over the trailing-twelve month EBITDA (earnings before interest, taxes, depreciation and amortization) as calculated by S&P LCD. This is the relevant, high-level pricing metric that private equity managers use in assessing deals. Data is published monthly.

US quarterly deal volume for private equity is the total deal volume in \$ billions (both equity and debt) reported in the quarter by Thomson Reuters Buyouts. This metric gives a measure of the level of activity in the market. Data is published quarterly.

U.S Private Real Estate Markets:

Metrics: US Cap Rates, Cap Rate Spreads, and Transactions as a % of Market Value

Real estate cap rates are a measure of the price paid in the market to acquire properties versus their annualized income generation before financing costs (NOI=net operating income). The data, published by NCREIF, describes completed and leased properties (core) on an unleveraged basis. We chose to use current value cap rates. These are capitalization rates from properties that were revalued during the quarter. This data relies on estimates of value and therefore tends to be lagging (estimated prices are slower to rise and slower to fall than transaction prices). The data is published quarterly.

Spreads between the cap rate (described above) and the 10-year nominal Treasury yield, indicate a measure of the cost of properties versus a current measure of the cost of financing.

Transactions as a % of Market Value Trailing-Four Quarters is a measure of property turnover activity in the NCREIF Universe. This quarterly metric is a measure of activity in the market.

Credit Markets US Fixed Income:

Metric: Spreads

The absolute level of spreads over treasuries and spread trends (widening / narrowing) are good indicators of credit risk in the fixed income markets. Spreads incorporate estimates of future default, but can also be driven by technical dislocations in the fixed income markets. Abnormally narrow spreads (relative to historical levels) indicate higher levels of valuation risk, wide spreads indicate lower levels of valuation risk and / or elevated default fears. Investment grade bond spreads are represented by the Barclays Capital US Corporate Investment Grade Index Intermediate Component. The high yield corporate bond spreads are represented by the Barclays Capital US Corporate High Yield Index.



METRIC DESCRIPTION, RATIONALE FOR SELECTION AND CALCULATION METHODOLOGY

Measure of Equity Market Fear / Uncertainty

Metric: VIX – Measure of implied option volatility for U.S. equity markets

The VIX is a key measure of near-term volatility conveyed by implied volatility of S&P 500 index option prices. VIX increases with uncertainty and fear. Stocks and the VIX are negatively correlated. Volatility tends to spike when equity markets fall.

Measure of Monetary Policy

Metric: Yield Curve Slope

We calculate the yield curve slope as the 10 year treasury yield minus the 1 year treasury yield. When the yield curve slope is zero or negative, this is a signal to pay attention. A negative yield curve slope signals lower rates in the future, caused by a contraction in economic activity. Recessions are typically preceded by an inverted (negatively sloped) yield curve. A very steep yield curve (2 or greater) indicates a large difference between shorter-term interest rates (the 1 year rate) and longer-term rates (the 10 year rate). This can signal expansion in economic activity in the future, or merely higher future interest rates.

Measures of US Inflation Expectations

Metrics: Breakeven Inflation and Inflation Adjusted Commodity Prices

Inflation is a very important indicator impacting all assets and financial instruments. Breakeven inflation is calculated as the 10 year nominal treasury yield minus the 10 year real yield on US TIPS (treasury inflation protected securities). Abnormally low long-term inflation expectations are indicative of deflationary fears. A rapid rise in breakeven inflation indicates an acceleration in inflationary expectations as market participants sell nominal treasuries and buy TIPs. If breakeven inflation continues to rise quarter over quarter, this is a signal of inflationary worries rising, which may cause Fed action and / or dollar decline. Commodity price movement (above the rate of inflation) is an indication of anticipated inflation caused by real global economic activity putting pressure on resource prices. We calculate this metric by adjusted in the Dow Jones UBS Commodity Index (formerly Dow Jones AIG Commodity Index) by US CPI-U. While rising commodity prices will not necessarily translate to higher US inflation, higher US inflation will likely show up in higher commodity prices, particularly if world economic activity is robust.

Measures of US Treasury Bond Interest Rate Risk

Metrics: 10-Year Treasury Forward-Looking Real Yield and 10-Year Treasury Duration

The expected annualized real yield of the 10 year U.S. Treasury Bond is a measure of valuation risk for U.S. Treasuries. A low real yield means investors will accept a low rate of expected return for the certainly of receiving their nominal cash flows. PCA estimates the expected annualized real yield by subtracting an estimate of expected 10 year inflation (produced by the Survey of Professional Forecasters as collected by the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia), from the 10 year Treasury constant maturity interest rate. Duration for the 10-Year Treasury Bond is calculated based on the current yield and a price of 100. This is a measure of expected percentage movements in the price of the bond based on small movements in percentage yield. We make no attempt to account for convexity.

Definition of "extreme" metric readings

A metric reading is defined as "extreme" if the metric reading is in the top or bottom decile of its historical readings. These "extreme" reading should cause the reader to pay attention. These metrics have reverted toward their mean values in the past.

PCA Market Sentiment Indicator

Explanation, Construction and Q&A

PCA has created the PCA Market Sentiment Indicator (PMSI) to <u>complement</u> our valuation focused PCA Investment Market Risk Metrics. This measure of sentiment is meant to capture significant and persistent shifts in long-lived market trends of economic growth risk, either towards a <u>risk seeking trend</u> or a <u>risk aversion trend</u>.

This paper explores:

- What is the PCA Market Sentiment Indicator (PMSI)?
- How do I read the indicator graph?
- How is the PCA Market Sentiment Indicator (PMSI) constructed?
- What do changes in the indicator mean?



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PCA Market Sentiment Indicator

PCA has created a market sentiment indicator for monthly publication (the PMSI – see below) to complement PCA's Investment Market Risk Metrics.

PCA's Investment Market Risk Metrics, which rely significantly on standard market measures of relative valuation, often provide valid early signals of increasing long-term risk levels in the global investment markets. However, as is the case with numerous valuation measures, the Risk Metrics may convey such risk concerns long before a market corrections take place. The PMSI helps to address this early-warning bias by measuring whether the markets are beginning to acknowledge key Risk Metrics trends, and / or indicating non-valuation based concerns. Once the PMSI indicates that the market sentiment has shifted, it is our belief that investors should consider significant action, particularly if confirmed by the Risk Metrics. Importantly, PCA believes the Risk Metrics and PMSI should always be used in conjunction with one another and never in isolation. The questions and answers below highlight and discuss the basic underpinnings of the PCA PMSI:

What is the PCA Market Sentiment Indicator (PMSI)?

The PMSI is a measure meant to gauge the market's sentiment regarding economic growth risk. Growth risk cuts across most financial assets, and is the largest risk exposure that most portfolios bear. The PMSI takes into account the momentum (trend over time, positive or negative) of the economic growth risk exposure of publicly traded stocks and bonds, as a signal of the future direction of growth risk returns; either positive (risk seeking market sentiment), or negative (risk averse market sentiment).

How do I read the PCA Market Sentiment Indicator (PMSI) graph?

Simply put, the PMSI is a color coded indicator that signals the market's sentiment regarding economic growth risk. It is read left to right chronologically. A green indicator on the PMSI indicates that the market's sentiment towards growth risk is positive. A gray indicator indicates that the market's sentiment towards growth risk is neutral or inconclusive. A red indicator indicates that the market's sentiment towards growth risk is negative. The black line on the graph is the level of the PMSI. The degree of the signal above or below the neutral reading is an indication the signal's current strength.

PCA Market Sentiment Indicator

How is the PCA Market Sentiment Indicator (PMSI) Constructed?

The PMSI is constructed from two sub-elements representing investor sentiment in stocks and bonds:

- 1. Stock return momentum: Return momentum for the S&P 500 Equity Index (trailing 12-months)
- 2. Bond yield spread momentum: Momentum of bond yield spreads (excess of the measured bond yield over the identical duration U.S. Treasury bond yield) for corporate bonds (trailing 12-months) for both investment grade bonds (75% weight) and high yield bonds (25% weight). The scale of this measure is adjusted to match that of the stock return momentum measure.

The black line reading on the graph is calculated as the average of the stock return momentum measure and the bonds spread momentum measure. The color reading on the graph is determined as follows:

- 1. If both stock return momentum and bond spread momentum are positive = GREEN (positive)
- 2. If one of the momentum indicators is positive, and the other negative = GRAY (inconclusive)
- 3. If both stock return momentum and bond spread momentum are negative = RED (negative)

What does the PCA Market Sentiment Indicator (PMSI) mean? Why might it be useful?

There is strong evidence that time series momentum is significant and persistent. In particular, across an extensive array of asset classes, the sign of the trailing 12-month return (positive or negative) is indicative of future returns (positive or negative) over the next 12 month period. The PMSI is constructed to measure this momentum in stocks and corporate bond spreads. A reading of green or red is agreement of both the equity and bond measures, indicating that it is likely that this trend (positive or negative) will continue over the next 12 months. When the measures disagree, the indicator turns gray. A gray reading does not necessarily mean a new trend is occurring, as the indicator may move back to green, or into the red from there. The level of the reading (black line) and the number of months at the red or green reading, gives the user additional information on which to form an opinion, and potentially take action.

Market Overview – Q1 2014

Key themes

- An unusually severe winter in the U.S. hampered first-quarter growth in employment, housing and retail sales, among other areas of the economy.
- The European Central Bank came under increasing pressure to lower interest rates or enact some form of quantitative easing to counter the threat of deflation and boost the region's slow arowth.
- China remained a focus of concern amid poor manufacturing data, higher levels of bad debt and slowing export growth.

Equities

- U.S. equities showed their resilience again in the first quarter, outperforming all major markets just as they did in 2013.
- When tapering has tapered off and interest rates have adjusted, U.S. equities should continue to outpace most other markets thanks to ample liquidity and a better earnings growth outlook.

Fixed Income

- The march toward higher interest rates predicted at the beginning of the year has stalled, in part because of concerns over growth in the United States and China and heightened market sensitivity to geopolitical risk.
- Bond yields will resume their slow climb, so investors should continue to seek shelter in the higher-yielding parts of the fixedincome market.



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

- Monthly job creation disappointed markets in January, with a below-consensus reading on nonfarm payrolls largely attributable to seasonal and weather-related anomalies. While employment growth improved in February, March employment numbers were not robust enough to signal a strong rebound for the nation's labor markets.
- Housing activity has generally slowed since last summer, and data releases during the first quarter were mixed to downbeat. New home sales, as well as sales of existing homes fell in the beginning of the year.
- All actively managed portfolios had positive absolute returns in Q1, though most slightly lagged their blended benchmarks after fees. U.S. equities and fixed income had similar returns during the quarter, so performance across many actively managed portfolios was comparable.
- Notable contributors to relative returns were the DFA Emerging Markets Core Equity Portfolio and the PIMCO Income Fund, both of which
 returned more than 100 basis points over their respective benchmark. Detractors were the T. Rowe Price Institutional Large Cap Growth Fund
 and Large Cap Value Fund. While posting positive returns in absolute terms, these two T. Rowe Price Funds both comprise a relatively large
 portion of many actively managed portfolios and lagged their benchmark for the quarter.



- Eight of the S&P 500's sectors advanced in the quarter, led by Utilities (+9.77%), Healthcare (5.69%), and Materials (+2.69%). Consumer Discretionary (-2.91%), Industrials (-0.02%), and Telecommunication Services (+0.11%) lagged.
- Foreign developed- and emerging-market equities returned 0.66% and -0.43%, respectively, as measured by MSCI indexes. After January's selloff, emerging markets bounced back in February and March amid signs of improving economic fundamentals and reduced worries over growth in China.
- Despite expectations that interest rates would rise during the quarter, the yield on the bellwether 10-year Treasury fell from 3.04% to 2.73%.
- All Passively Managed Portfolios posted gains for the quarter and performed either in line with, or slightly underperformed their benchmarks net of underlying mutual fund expenses, program management fees, and the impact of fair value pricing for the international index funds.
- Contributing to Q1 relative performance was the TC Life Funding Agreement (+28 basis points vs. benchmark). The Funding Agreement has been consistently outperforming the 3 Month Treasury Bill Index during the recent low interest rate environment.
- The Index U.S. Equity Portfolio, with exposure to the broad U.S. stock market through the TIAA-CREF Equity Index Fund, generated the highest absolute returns for the quarter, benefiting from the strength of the U.S. equity markets. The Index International Equity Portfolio had the lowest absolute performance in Q1 due to its allocation to the international equity markets, which had lower returns.


